From the Principal

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Interview Day – 2020

Although we are still very busy finishing off 2019, we have been completing many tasks that relate to 2020. One of these tasks is organising an opportunity for all of our families to meet with their child's teacher on the first day of Term 1, 2020. Information that explains this process will be posted via Compass next week.

Our 2020 Prep students will have a slightly different schedule for their interviews. Details relating to these interviews will be circulated next week.

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Curriculum Days in 2020

Other than the first day of Term 1 (January 28th), being a state-wide curriculum day, we are yet to finalise our remaining three curriculum days for 2020. These will be discussed with School Council early next year and families will be given ample warning via our newsletter.

Step-Up Day

While our Grade Six students were involved in their transition day on Tuesday, all remaining children participated in our Step-Up Day. This gave every child the opportunity to 'have a go' at the next level, in preparation for 2020. While some transitions in a primary school are relatively straightforward, some can be significant, and for some children the move can be daunting. By giving every child the opportunity to 'see' what it is like in the next class we aim to build confidence in every child so that they are ready to go at the beginning of next year, having some idea of what to expect. On the Step-Up day we were able to introduce our confirmed teaching teams for 2020 to the children. Confirmed class placements, including each child's new teacher (from Grades Prep-6), were sent home to all families on this day.

The task of constructing the grades is always a very complex one that has taken the teachers significant time to complete. Every child is in a grade with one of the friends that they wrote on their list. We take in to consideration a considerable amount of information and try our utmost to get the best balance for everyone. All parent requests were given due consideration as part of this process. Many of these requests were fully met or partially met. In some cases we were not able to cater for parent requests. Given these thorough processes, I haven't moved any children from their allocated class during my 15 years as Principal and that will continue to be the case.

Parent Helpers/Volunteers Morning Tea

Spring Gully Primary School values the contribution of parents/volunteers and would like to recognise these important contributions with a "Parent Helpers/Volunteers Morning Tea" on Monday, 16th of December from 11am. The staff would like to see our new staffroom overflowing. There is no need to bring anything other than yourself.

Reports – FAQs

When are Reports released to families?

Reports are released via Compass next Wednesday 18th December. Hard copies are only printed on request. Please be mindful that a likely high volume of traffic on the Compass site **may** impact download speeds. If you have any issues accessing your child/children's Report, please feel free to contact me.

With the introduction of Learning Tasks this semester, what differences will I notice on my child's Report?

Learning Tasks have provided families with regular information about student progress, primarily in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Due to this, Reports will not include a specific Literacy and Mathematics comment section, as they have previously. However, teachers may choose to include commentary in the Teacher Comment section relating to these areas of learning.

Your child's Report will include:

- **The 'Dot-Point' page:** indicating where your child sits in each key learning area against the Victorian Curriculum.
- **Approaches to Learning:** similar to the previous 'Work Habits', indicating personal and interpersonal skills exhibited by your child.
- **Attendance:** days absent this semester.

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- **A Teacher Comment:** a summary written by your child's teacher aimed at capturing your child's semester. It will include how your child engages in their learning, mixes with their peers, some key achievements and possibly an area to keep working on, among other elements chosen for commentary. Our focus for this comment is around capturing your child as a learner, but also as a person.
- **Student Comment:** your child's reflection of the semester
- **Specialist Sections:** reporting on your child's progress in Art, German, Physical Education, Drama, Health and History. We have moved away from written comments for our Specialist staff and are introducing a 'tick box' format that addresses '*Learning Achievements*', which are written by each Specialist teacher. This decision was based on some of the challenges associated with our Specialist staff teaching all 400 students for 45mins per week. This change was supported by feedback from our School Council.

How do Learning Tasks and Reports relate to each other?

Each semester, the seven Learning Tasks and final Report make up the complete 'formal' reporting package for families. Learning Tasks are designed to regularly provide information to families about their child's progress, honing in on significant moments in your child's learning throughout the semester. The Report is designed to provide a summary of your child's learning over the whole semester and indicate their overall progress against the Victorian Curriculum.

We welcome feedback from our community about our change to a progressive reporting model, implemented this semester. In the newsletter next week, there will be a link provided to a survey where families may choose to provide feedback.

Netbook Collection – Grade 6

Netbooks will be collected from all students in Grade 6 Tuesday 17th December, so that they can be prepared for Grade 3 students in 2020.

Prior to this day, students need to:

- ensure that any data they wish to keep has been removed
- have their netbook looking neat and tidy, with name tags removed
- have their charger at school to hand in with their netbook. Missing chargers will be billed to families.

Medicines and EpiPens + Anaphylaxis, Allergy and Asthma Management Plans for 2020

On the final day of Term 4, we request that parents collect any medicines or EpiPens that are currently at school for your child/children.

Students with existing plans for allergies, asthma and/or anaphylaxis will have blank plans/management documents sent home early next week. These will need to be returned to school on Interview Day, Wednesday 29th January 2020. As part of our policies and consistent with DET guidelines, these documents must be revised and updated at the beginning of each school year. 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
