Statement of Philosophy

At Spring Gully Primary School we foster optimistic and resilient students who are motivated to learn. Staff are positive, professional and committed to providing curriculum which is stimulating, relevant and diverse; building strong foundations for all learners. Learning opportunities enable students to become active citizens in the global community and promote environmental awareness, inclusiveness and diversity.

At SGPS we place significant value on the collective efficacy of our staff and understand that to achieve the best possible learning outcomes for students, we need to cultivate an environment that prioritises ongoing professional learning, reflection and collaboration for all of our educators.

The *Rights, Resilience and Respectful Relationships* program has an important place in our school culture in fostering social and emotional learning for students and in outlining a standard of expectation for all stakeholders in establishing and maintaining relationships which are respectful, regardless of race, gender, ethnicity or sexuality. School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS), a restorative approach to supporting students and the emphasis we place upon student voice, agency and leadership; all contribute to providing a safe and respectful learning environment for our whole community.

Our School Values underpin our actions, how we treat each other and how we engage with the wider community. Spring Gully Primary School is a safe and nurturing learning environment that actively develops and values the partnership between home, school and the community.
